# 2 Medical Cannabis – Written Certifications – Certifying Providers

- FOR the purpose of authorizing certain dentists, podiatrists, nurse midwives, and nurse practitioners, in addition to physicians, to issue written certifications to qualifying patients by substituting the defined term "certifying provider" for "certifying physician" as it relates to laws governing medical cannabis; making conforming changes; making a stylistic change; <u>providing for a delayed effective date</u>; and generally relating to providers authorized to provide written certifications for medical cannabis.

9 (2)Includes a written statement certifying that, in the [physician's] 10 **PROVIDER'S** professional opinion, after having completed an assessment of the patient's 11 medical history and current medical condition, the patient has a condition:

14(ii) For which the potential benefits of the medical use of cannabis 15would likely outweigh the health risks for the patient; and

20The Commission shall register as a certifying [physician] **PROVIDER** an (a) individual who: 21

22Meets the requirements of this subtitle; and (1)

23(2)Submits application materials that meet the requirements of this subtitle. 24

25To be registered as a certifying [physician] **PROVIDER**, a [physician] (b) 26**PROVIDER** shall submit a proposal to the Commission that includes:

27(1)The reasons for including a patient under the care of the [physician] 28**PROVIDER** for the purposes of this subtitle, including the patient's qualifying medical 29conditions:

1 (2) An attestation that a standard patient evaluation will be completed, 2 including a history, a physical examination, a review of symptoms, and other pertinent 3 medical information; and

4 (3) The [physician's] **PROVIDER'S** plan for the ongoing assessment and 5 follow-up care of a patient and for collecting and analyzing data.

6 (c) The Commission may not require an individual to meet requirements in 7 addition to the requirements listed in subsections (a) and (b) of this section to be registered 8 as a certifying [physician] **PROVIDER**.

9 (d) (1) The Commission is encouraged to approve [physician] **PROVIDER** 10 applications for the following medical conditions:

(i) A chronic or debilitating disease or medical condition that results
 in a patient being admitted into hospice or receiving palliative care; or

13 (ii) A chronic or debilitating disease or medical condition or the 14 treatment of a chronic or debilitating disease or medical condition that produces:

- 15 1. Cachexia, anorexia, or wasting syndrome;
- 16 2. Severe or chronic pain;
- 173.Severe nausea;
- 184.Seizures; or
- 19 5. Severe or persistent muscle spasms.

20 (2) The Commission may not limit treatment of a particular medical 21 condition to one class of [physicians] **PROVIDERS**.

(e) The Commission may approve applications that include any other condition
that is severe and for which other medical treatments have been ineffective if the symptoms
reasonably can be expected to be relieved by the medical use of cannabis.

(f) (1) A certifying [physician] PROVIDER or the spouse of a certifying
[physician] PROVIDER may not receive any gifts from or have an ownership interest in a
medical cannabis grower, a processor, or a dispensary.

28 (2) A certifying [physician] **PROVIDER** may receive compensation from a 29 medical cannabis grower, a processor, or **A** dispensary if the certifying [physician] 30 **PROVIDER**:

1 (a) Any of the following persons acting in accordance with the provisions of this 2 subtitle may not be subject to arrest, prosecution, or any civil or administrative penalty, 3 including a civil penalty or disciplinary action by a professional licensing board, or be 4 denied any right or privilege, for the medical use of cannabis:

12 (d) This subtitle may not be construed to require a hospital, medical facility, or 13 hospice program to report to the Commission any disciplinary action taken by the hospital, 14 medical facility, or hospice program against a certifying [physician] **PROVIDER**, including 15 the revocation of privileges, after the registration of the certifying [physician] **PROVIDER** 16 by the Commission.
